The expenditure is debitable to Demand No.68, Ministry of Minority Affairs Major Head- "3601" Grant-in-aid to State Government, 02- Grants for State Plan Scheme (Sub Major Head), 378 -General-(Welfare of Schedule Casts, Schedule Tribes, Other Backward Classes and Minorities) -other grants (Minor Head), 01 – Multi-sectoral Development Programme for minorities, 01.00.31 - Grant-in-aid general for the year 2014-15.

3. Since it is fresh release, no Utilisation Certificate is pending. Utilization Certificate for this grant should be submitted by the grantee in the prescribed format within 12 months of the date of the Sanction Order.
